- 3. One copy of 10+2 Marks sheet issued by a recognized board.
- 4. One copy of HP domicile certificate for girl students for the exemption of tuition fee.
- 5. Original character certificate from head of the institution last attended in case of a student seeking admission to BA/B.Com 1st year for the 1st time.
- 6. A student seeking admission from a board/university other than from HPU will have to produce his/her Migration certificate (original).
- 7. Affidavit wherever applicable.
- 8. One copy of certificate of SC/ST from Magistrate Class-1 for seeking relaxation in age and benefit of reservation in the respective category.
- 9. One copy of Aadhar Card. (Self attested)
- 10. One copy of bank passbook front page (Self-attested)

Note: - The character certificate must not have been issued more than six months prior to the date of admission.

In case of a student who has discontinued his/her studies for one or more than one year the character certificate must be supplemented by another character certificate obtained from a Gazetted Class-1 Officer or the Panchayat Pradhan of the village. A student has to submit an affidavit for the gap year. Admission shall not be allowed in any case to the students with compartment at 10+2 level.

INTRODUCTION

Govt. College Dhami at 16 Mile is an educational institution providing meritorious service of national level. The College is named after a place called 'Dhami' which is of historic importance. Dhami was a Princely State founded by the descendents of Prithvi Raj Chauhan in the 13th Century. It is situated 16 miles west of Shimla and has became a constituent of Himachal Pradesh in 1948. The Dhami *Prajamandal* movement played a significant role in the independence of India which resulted into the famous incident known as Dhami *Goli Kand*. The famous festival of stones *Patharon –Ka-Mela* held after Diwali is still a unique feature of Dhami's cultural life. It's a beautiful drive from Shimla Towards Mandi till *Solah-Meel-Ka-Mor* to enter into the beautiful scenic place popularly known as Dhami. Its sheer isolation, captivating beauty, history and folklores all combined together to make it a mysterious and an irresistible place to visit. ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR ADMISSION TO BA/B.COM. 1ST YEAR, 2ND YEAR & 3RDYEAR:-

A candidate who has passed in the Higher Secondary Examination (Academic Stream) conducted by the HP Board of School Education or an examination accepted as equivalent thereto by the various bodies of the HP University.

provided that the candidates who have passed the qualifying examination with Arts/Humanities stream shall be given admission to the B.A. program.

provided that the candidates who have passed the qualifying examination with Commerce stream shall be given preference in admission to B.Com. program.

Age limit:- For first admission to the First Year of the Degree Course, the maximum age limit is 23 years for General category candidates, 25 years for Girl candidates as on 1st July, 2021 In case of SC/ST candidates, a relaxation of 3 years is applicable. The Vice Chancellor, H.P. University Shimla, may, in exceptional cases/circumstances, to be recorded in writing, give relaxation in age up to a maximum of six months to the candidates. All such cases may be provisionally granted age relaxation up to six months by the Principal of the college and a consolidated list of all such cases will be sent for approval of the Vice Chancellor by the 31st October of every academic year.

MINIMUM PERCENTAGE OF MARKS REQUIRED FOR ADMISSION IS AS UNDER:-

- (i) B.A. (Pass Course) 35%
- (ii) B.A. (With Maths): 45% (in aggregate or in Maths)
- (iii) B.Com. (Pass Course): 45 % (35% for girls, 40% for students who have passed 10+2 with Commerce).
- (iv) Admission to 2nd Year & 3rd year will be on roll- on bases and will remain provisional till the declaration of the result of previous class or till further directions from H.P. Govt./H.P. University

1. RESERVATION OF SEATS (ORDINANCE 3.14)

The institution follows the reservation policy of H.P. Government/ H.P. University in Admissions. All the seats are filled according to the reservation roster devised/ adopted by H.P.

University:

These reservations will be applicable to those, who have passed their qualifying examination from H.P. Board of School Education or from any other school located within territorial jurisdiction of Himachal Pradesh or if the candidate is a bonafide resident of Himachal Pradesh. The sports and cultural seats will be allotted on the basis of those events which are recognized by HPU sports and co-curricular council. The final decision under sports and cultural quota will be after approval from HPU and with the respective committees, constituted for the same. For reservation the following roster will be followed:

ADMISSION PROCESS/GUIDELINES FOR ADMISSION TO B.A./B.Com. 1ST YEAR, 2nd YEAR/3RD YEAR

All the students seeking admission in B.A/B.Com (UG) will have to apply online. All the admissions to first year will be on merit basis.

One seat in each course will be reserved for single girl child.

DOCUMENTS REQUIRED FOR ONLINE ADMISSION

- 1. Scanned copies of all Board/Univ. certificates from matriculation onwards.
- 2. Scanned copy of character certificate from the head of institution last attended.
- 3. A valid own/family member mobile number/Email account.
- 4. Recent passport size photograph scanned in 140 x 180 pixel resolution and less than 200 KB in size.
- 6. The candidates from other Boards/University, must submit: a. Eligibility certificate from H.P. Board/University showing equivalence. b. Migration Certificate.
- $7.\,SC/ST\,s canned\,certificate\,for\,those\,seeking\,relaxation\,or\,weightage.$
- 8. The candidate belonging to IRDP, NCC, NSS, Sports, Cultural Quota seeking relaxation or weightage must upload scanned copy of corresponding certificate.
- 9. All students from 2ndyear onwards have to fill HP University Roll No. 10. All girl candidates have to upload scanned copy of Bonafide Himachali Certificate for getting Exemption from Tuition fee as per Notification. Edu H(8) 3 (8) 1/76 dated 29-06-2001.
- 11. All fields marked with red star are mandatory.
- 12. If by mistake you have submitted wrong information, you can edit (Except DOB and your name) from your Student Login.
- 13. Choose the Date of Birth (DOB) and Gender carefully; Age related eligibilities will be based on these Fields.

- 14. Click on Register Button. Note: Please don't click multiple time as registration process may take some time to proceed
- 15. Please note after registration process you must login into admission portal and complete your application form.
- 16. The candidate will complete the process of admission by depositing the required fee .

General Admission Rules and Procedures

- 1. The admission to B.A./B.Com. 1st year will be on merit basis. The seats for various categories will be allotted in accordance to 200 points reservation roster.
- 2. Students seeking exemption from Tuition fee for disability must attach a self-attested copy of disability certificate issued by competent authorities.
- 3. Self-attested photocopy of Himachal domicile Certificate for Tuition Fee concession (Girl students only).
- 4. The students of NIOS (National Institute of Open School) who have passed all five subjects by securing requisite marks will be admitted.
- 5. Admission to various classes will be made on the recommendation of the Admission committee constituted for the purpose.
- 6. Students are advised to pay their dues personally on notified dates, failing which his/her claim for admission stands forfeited and seat(s) so vacated will be allotted to the next candidate in merit. Fees and funds once deposited will not be refunded.
- 7. Registration fee will not be charged from a student who migrates from other college if he/she is already registered with HP university.
- 8. Fee structure can be changed/modified according to the guidelines/instructions of higher authorities.
- 9. A student expelled from any college/university or found indulged in any kind of indiscipline activity will not be admitted to the college.
- 10. Students having compartment(s) in 10+2 examination are ineligible for admission.
- 11. In case, a candidate got admitted by furnishing wrong document(s)/information or by concealing the facts, his/her admission will be cancelled.
- 12. The Principal reserves the right to refuse to admit student(s) only for valid reasons.

CHOICE BASED CREDIT SYSTEM (CBCS)

The list of undergraduate disciplines/courses offered by the College to be covered under CBCS as per UGC template is:

Bachelor Courses:

1. B.A

2. B.Com

Outlines of Choice Based Credit System:

- 1. Core Course: Four discipline specific papers each for regular courses and two papers each for English and Hindi/MIL (B.A./B.Com): The papers under this category are going to be taught uniformly across all universities with 30% deviation proposed in the draft. The purpose of fixing core papers is to ensure that all the institutions follow a minimum common curriculum so that each institution/university adheres to common minimum standard. Also the course designed for papers under this category aim to cover the basics that a student is expected to imbibe in that particular discipline. A course, which is studied by a candidate as a core requirement is termed as a Core course.
- **2. Elective Course:** Generally a course which can be chosen from a pool of courses and which may be very specific or specialized or advanced or supportive to the discipline/subject of study or which provides an extended scope or which enables an exposure to some other discipline/subject/domain or nurtures the candidate's proficiency/skill is called an Elective Course.
- (i) Discipline Specific Elective (DSE) Course (2 each for regular courses): Elective courses offered under the main discipline/subject of study are referred to as Discipline Specific Elective course. The list provided under this category are suggestive in nature and each University has complete freedom to suggest their own papers under this category based on their expertise, specialization, requirements, scope and need. The University/Institute may also offer discipline related Elective courses of interdisciplinary nature (to be offered by main discipline/subject of study).
- (ii) Generic Elective (GE) Course: (2 each for B.A. /B.Com.regular courses): An elective Course chosen from an unrelated discipline/subject, with an intention to seek exposure beyond discipline/s of choice is called a Generic Elective. The purpose of this category of papers is to offer the students the option to explore disciplines of interest beyond the choices they make in Core and Discipline Specific Elective papers. The list provided under this category are suggestive in nature and each University has complete freedom to suggest their own papers under this category based on their expertise, specialization, requirements, scope and need.

P.S.: A core course offered in a discipline/subject may be treated as an elective by other

Discipline/subject and vice versa and such electives may also be referred to as Generic Elective.

- **3. Ability Enhancement Courses (AEC):** The Ability Enhancement (AE) Courses may be of two kinds: Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC) and Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC). "AECC" courses are the courses based upon the content that leads to Knowledge Enhancement; i). Environmental Science and ii). English/Hindi/MIL Communication. These are mandatory for all disciplines. SEC courses are value-based and/or skill-based and are aimed at providing hands-on-training, competencies, skills, etc.
- **4. Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC):** (4 for regular courses): These courses may be chosen from a pool of courses designed to provide value-based and/or skill-based knowledge and should contain both theory and lab/hands-on/training/field work. The main purpose of these courses is to provide students life-skills in hands-on mode so as to increase their employability. The list provided under this category are suggestive in nature and each University has complete freedom to suggest their own papers under this category based on their expertise, specialization, requirements, scope and need.
- **5.** Practical/tutorials (One each with every core and discipline/generic specific elective

paper): The list of practical provided is suggestive in nature and each university has the freedom to add/subtract/edit practical from the list depending on their faculty and infrastructure available. Addition will however be of similar nature.

CREDIT SCHEME

- 1. An Undergraduate degree in Humanities/ Social Sciences/ Commerce may be awarded if a student completes 4 core courses each in two disciplines of choice, 2 core courses each in English and Hindi/MIL respectively, 2 Ability Enhancement Compulsory Courses (AECC), minimum 4 Skill Enhancement Courses (SEC), 2 courses each from a list of Discipline Specific Elective courses based on the two disciplines of choice selected above, respectively, and two courses from the list of Generic Electives courses.
- 2. For the purpose of computation of work-load the following mechanism may be adopted:
 - i) 1 Credit = 1 Theory period of one hour duration per week
 - ii) 1 Credit = 1 Tutorial period of one hour duration per week
 - iii) 1 Credit = 1 Practical period of two hour duration per week

IMPORTANT INSTRUCTION

- (a) Acandidateshallalsoberequiredtofulfillthefollowingconditionstoappear in the annual examinations:-
 - (i) 75% attendance is compulsory in theory and practical.
 - (ii) 75% attendance is mandatory in seminars and submission of assignments.
 - (iii) It shall be compulsory to score minimum 50% marks in aggregate in house examination.
 - (iv) Itshallalsobemandatorytoparticipateinactivitiesofsubjectsocieties.
 - (v) The University annual examination forms hall be treated as provisional unless and until the eligibility criteria mentioned above for appearing in annual examination is fulfilled by the candidate and a certificate to this effect is received from the Principal of the concerned College at least 15 days prior to the start of annual/practical examination.
- (b) Apart from compulsory subjects, the subject combinations and number of seats shall be decided by the College concerned.

For determining CCA for a student enrolled for the Academic session will account for 30 % of the total marks i.e. 100. The break up to 30% marks in given below:-

For the 1st, 2nd & 3rd Year

- i) 5 marks for attendance
- ii) 5 marks for class test to be taken on completion of 40% syllabus by the class teacher.
- iii) 10 marks for unit/house test to be taken on completion of 75% of syllabus.
- iv) 10 marks for assignment, tutorials, general behavior of student.

CLASS ROOM ATTENDANCE INCENTIVE:

MIGRATION

- 1. Migration from other college to Govt. Degree College, Dhami at 16 Mile, District Shimla and vice-versa is governed by HPU rules.
- 2. No migration certificate can be issued unless the student is registered with university. A migrating student will not be admitted to the college if the subject/ courses studied by him/her previously are not available in the college.
- 3. The migrating student must submit the following documents/information:
 - Lecture attendance statement (of all subjects offered)
 - Statement of credits earned by the students under CCA
 - Character certificate from the Principal of the college last attended.
- 4. After migration has been sanctioned and notified by the HPU, the student must join the second college within the time period stipulated by the HPU.
- 5. The college first joined is entitled to the tuition fee for the month in which the university

- sanctions the migration. The second college is not entitled to the tuition fee for the month or part thereof.
- 6. The admission of the students migrating from another university or from and affiliated college or institution in the same course (including ICDEOL) shall be governed by the regulations framed by the Executive Council of HPU from time to time.
- 7. The admission of the student migrating from another university shall be treated as provisional and shall be confirmed when he/she produces the migration certificate issued by the University and a certificate of good conduct issued by the Head of the Institution last attended.
- 8. A student disqualified by another university shall not be given admission during the period of the disqualification.

The Scholarships / Concessions available are:

- 1. Post -Matriculation Scholarship for SC/ST students whose parents annual income does not exceed Rs 2,50,000.
- 2. Post –matric scholarship for students belonging to minorities whose income is below 200,000/- (Rupees two lakh) per annumand marks not less than 50 per cent.
- 3. Indira Gandhi Utkrisht Chhatrvriti Yojana for Post 10 +2 students: the scholarship under this shall be awarded to 10 male toppers each from merit list of 10+2 (Arts, Science and Commerce)@ of 10,000 per annum.
- **4. Post +2 Scholarship scheme:** Under this scheme the first 100 students from the merit list of 10+2 class supplied by the HP board of School Education, Dharmshala will be selected provided they join the first year of the degree course
- **5. Maharishi Valmiki scholarship for girls:** This scholarship is meant for girls who belong to the Valmiki family and whose parent in engaged in unclean profession, the amount for the same is Rs 9000/- per annum.
- **6. IRDP/BPL scholarship scheme:** The student who belongs to IRDP/BPL families may apply for this scholarship with required documents. A sum of Rs. 1200/- per annum is provided as financial assistance.
- **7. Govt.of India Scholarship for Handicapped students:** This scholarship is available to the physically handicapped students only through HP Welfare department.
- **8. Soldier Board Scholarship:** The children of Ex-servicemen may apply for this scholarship to the District Soldiers' Board. The prescribed form can be obtained from the office of this board/ college office.
- **9.** Scholarship for children of Army personnel Martyred/Disabled during war: Eligible students may apply to the District Soldier's Board through the head of the Institution. The amount of scholarship is Rs 1200/- per annum.
- 10. **Kalpana Chawala Chatrvriti**: State scholarship for the 2000 meritorious +2 girls students of all study groups named Kalpana Chawala Chatrvriti Yojana has been started from 2012-13 onwards. The deserving candidates will be awarded a scholarship of Rs. 15,000/- per student per annum.

PAYMENT OF FEE:

- 1. Tuition fee shall be charged for 12 months (June to May) as per schedule.
- 2. Fee and other charges are to be paid (without fine) on the dates fixed by the office for each class notified from time to time. Those who pay the college dues after the dates fixed for their class will have to pay the fine for the delay.
- 3. Fee, fine and other dues once paid, will not be refunded.
- 4. The students who do not pay their dues as per schedule dates will be charged Rs. 10/Per day as the late fee and as per the schedule fixed by the college/ university from time to time.
- 5. Tuition fee from the following students will not be charged:
 - i. Girl's students.
 - ii. Among real brothers/sisters, only one will be exempted.
 - iii. Physical disability above 40%.

FEE STRUCTURE

Fee will be charged as under:

- 1. At the time of admission for the whole academic year or twelve months.
- 2. This fee is subject to change i.e. if the fee is revised, the student will have to pay the revised fee
- 3. Himachal Pradesh University charges: As decided by the HPU Gyan Path from time to time.

COLLEGE MAGAZINE: The College magazine '*Navpalash*' is published every year. This magazine provides a platform to hone the skill of the students in writing/creativity under different sections of the magazine. The students having a flair for writing have to submit the articles within the stipulated time period for inclusion in the magazine.

CAREER GUIDANCE AND COUNCELING CELL: A career guidance and counseling cell is operative in the college under the direct guidance and supervision of the College Principal. The object of the cell is to inform /guide the students regarding different career opportunities in professional and administrative arenas.

COLLEGE STUDENTS CENTRAL ASSOCIATION (CSCA): The College will have a CSCA constituted as per HPU rules and regulations in force from time to time.

COLLEGE IDENTITY CARD: Once the admission of a student to the college is confirmed, he/she should collect his/her identity card from the college office/the Librarian well in time as per the schedule notified by the office/Librarian. It is compulsory for all the students to carry the college identity card with them daily and to produce it for verification as and when demanded by the college authorities. The loss of identity card must be reported immediately to the college authorities. One has to file an FIR in order to get a duplicate I-Card on payment of Rs. 20/- within one week.

PARENT-TEACHER ASSOCIATION: The College has constituted the Parents Teachers Association from the Session 2016-17. Every student is supposed to contribute Rs. 600/- P.A. towards PTA. Parent-Teachers Association has been formed in the college with the avowed object of promoting participation of parents in the developmental activities of the College. Their presence and valuable suggestions are eagerly solicited by the staff in PTA meetings. Elections to the general body of the PTA are held at the start of academic session every year. The executive body comprises the following members:

- 1. Principal of the College-Patron of the body.
- 2. Parents or Guardians (only those who have blood relation with the students studying in the college.)
- 3. Teachers.

LEAVE RULES

- 1. It is compulsory for all the students to get their leave sanctioned before proceeding on any kind of leave.
- 2. For leave on medical ground, the student will be required to submit a medical certificate in case the leave is for more than a week's duration.
- 3. Leave up to one week will be sanctioned by the concerned teacher. For leave extending more than one week's duration, the student shall have to apply to the Principal.
- 4. A student will not be allowed to avail more than ten days leave during the entire academic session, except under exceptional circumstance.
- 5. If a student remains absent for ten days continuously without information, his/her name will be struck off from the rolls of the college.
- 6. Even if a student is on leave, he/she will have to deposit his/her fee as per the scheduled date decided by the college.

RE-ADMISSION:

Students can seek re-admission twice during the session. First re-admission will be allowed within ten days after the name is struck off after paying a fine of Rs. 100/- and a fine of Rs. 200/- will be charged for the second re-admission within ten days after the name is struck off from the rolls. No student will be allowed to seek admission after two times of re-admission.

IMPORTANT COLLEGE RULES FOR STRICT COMPLIANCE:

- 1. The Principal and the members of the staff have the power to take disciplinary action against students indulging in act of indiscipline, which may lead to imposing fine, or suspension, rustication or expulsion of the guilty student.
- 2. Students are directed to switch off their mobiles as and when they enter class rooms. Playing music and songs on mobile phones is strictly prohibited. Student found indulging in it will be penalized.
- 3. The prior approval of college authorities to organize the function /activity in the college campus is required.
- 4. Pasting of unauthorized posters in the college, writing on the wall, blackboards and notice board is strictly prohibited.
- 5. A student bringing outsider in the college campus will be severely punished. Outsiders are not allowed to roam about in the college campus.
- 6. Roaming about in the campus, corridors and outside classrooms during vacant periods and causing disturbance to work in this manner is highly undesirable and will be considered an act of indiscipline.
- 7. Damage of any kind to college property including defacement of walls, damage to furniture, etc. is an act of indiscipline.
- 8. Use of Alcohol and drugs is strictly prohibited. Any student found indulging in it will be

- penalized.
- 9. Smoking chewing of tobacco/gutka is strictly prohibited and any infringement may entail a fine of rupees 100/-.
- 11. It is mandatory for all the students to carry their identity cards daily to the college . The loss of the card should be reported through FIR immediately .

GRIEVANCES AND REDRESSAL MECHANISM

- 1. The students will have the right to make an appeal against any component of evaluation. Such appeal has to made to the Principal of the College on a prescribed form and should clearly state in writing the reason(s) for the complaint/appeal.
- 2. The appeal will be placed before the grievance Redressal committee (GRC), Chaired by the college Principal for cases pertaining the core/elective/generic courses.
- 3. Any other type of grievance may be heard by the said committee.

ANTI-RAGGING

All students are hereby cautioned that ragging is a criminal offence. "Ragging" include any type of physical and mental torture inflicted by an individual or group, either by words or by conduct, which creates an apprehension in the mind of the person that he/she cannot pursue his/her studies free from any mental disturbance or torture created thereby. Any person who aids or abets such an action shall also be guilty of such ragging."

Ragging in and around the college/hostel campus or on roads/approaches leading thereto is strictly prohibited. If any student is found indulging in ragging directly or indirectly, the college authorities shall be obliged under Rule 22.17 (a) (b) (c) of HPU to expel the guilty student(s) from the college/hostel and to report the matter to the Police as the ragging the amounts to a criminal offence as per the recent judgment of the Hon'ble HP High Court and the Govt. of HP.

The students indulging in Ragging will be punished by Law with a Fine up to Rs. 50,000/- and Imprisonment up to three years or both.
