Action Taken Report (ATR)

1. Restoration of the Arts Block

The college made sincere and consistent efforts to restore the damaged Arts Block. The damage was caused by a landslide that affected the area below the building, leading to cracks in the structure. All relevant authorities were informed immediately, and regular follow-ups were done. The Department of Higher Education took the issue seriously and approved the required budget. The restoration work was assigned to the Public Works Department (PWD), Himachal Pradesh. So far, the retaining wall to support the foundation pillars has been built, and the rock pilling work has also been completed.

2. Temporary Affiliation for Science Stream

The University Inspection Committee visited the college on 3rd July 2025 to assess the readiness for temporary affiliation of the Science Stream. Based on their inspection, the committee recommended granting temporary affiliation, and the college has received a positive report from Himachal Pradesh University (HPU).

3. Procurement of Science Lab Equipment

The college has procured additional equipment and chemicals for the Chemistry and Zoology laboratories. An approximate amount of ₹60,000 was spent to enhance lab infrastructure and ensure better practical learning for students.

4. Establishment of IT Laboratory

A regular IT Lab has been established in the college during this academic session. The lab is now functional with 13 computers, providing students access to essential IT facilities and digital learning resources.
