



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## INTRODUCTION

Govt. College Dhami at 16 Mile is the only institute of tertiary education in the region providing fruits of higher education to the youth of the area. This College was announced in January 2016 by the then Chief Minister of Himachal Pradesh, Late Sh. Virbhadra Singh. The official notification was issued in February 2016 vide letter no EDN-A- Ka (1)-2/2012-L-Pt Dated 15<sup>th</sup> February 2016. The College is affiliated to NAAC Accredited Grade A Himachal Pradesh University. The College is named after a place called 'Dhami' which is of historic importance. Dhami was a Princely State founded by the descendants of Prithvi Raj Chauhan in the 13<sup>th</sup> Century AD. It is situated 16 miles west of Shimla and has become a constituent of Himachal Pradesh in 1948.

The Dhami *Prajamandal* movement played a significant role in the independence of India which resulted into the famous incident known as Dhami *Goli Kand*. The famous festival of stones. *Patharon-Ka-Mela* held after Diwali is still a unique feature of Dhami's cultural life. It is a beautiful drive from Shimla towards Mandi till *Solah-Meel-Ka-Mor* to enter into the beautiful scenic place popularly known as Dhami. Its sheer isolation, captivating beauty, history and folklore all combined together make it a mysterious and irresistible place to visit. The students of this college are nurtured to become part of a vibrant ecosystem with only nine years of education saturated with rich culture and tradition.



An annual review meeting of the college staff was held on 27 October 2025 under the chairmanship of the worthy Principal, Dr. Dinesh Singh Kanwar, to review the co-curricular, extra-curricular, and extension activities conducted during the academic session 2024–25.

The meeting commenced with the opening remarks by the Chair, wherein the Principal emphasized the importance of holistic education and the role of co-curricular, extra-curricular, and extension activities in the overall development of students.

A detailed review of the activities conducted by various departments, NSS, Rovers & Rangers, Women Cell, and Sports Committee during the session 2024–25 was presented. The outcomes of these activities were discussed, highlighting student participation, achievements, community engagement, and the impact on skill development, social awareness, and leadership qualities.

The members deliberated on the outcomes of the activities, identifying best practices as well as areas requiring improvement. Suggestions and proposals for the forthcoming academic session were discussed, with emphasis on enhancing student participation, organizing more inter-collegiate activities, strengthening community outreach programmes, and introducing innovative and skill-oriented initiatives.

The Chair appreciated the collective efforts of faculty and students in successfully organizing various activities and encouraged all departments to plan well-structured, outcome-based programmes in alignment with institutional goals for the next academic session.

## Review Report

### Academic Activities

During the session 2024–25, the institution recorded excellent academic performance with an overall pass percentage of 94.73% and 71.13% students securing A grade and above. Senior classes, particularly B.A. III, B.Com III, and Science streams, achieved near-perfect results, reflecting effective teaching-learning practices, continuous internal assessment, mentoring, and academic support systems. Academic enrichment through educational tours, workshops, training camps, computer skill courses, and expert lectures significantly enhanced conceptual understanding, practical exposure, research orientation, and employability skills.

**Suggestion:** In the coming years, the institution may focus on outcome-based education, introduction of value-added certificate courses, increased student research projects, and greater use of ICT-enabled and blended learning methods to further enhance academic quality.

### Co-Curricular Activities

The college actively organized co-curricular activities such as poster making, slogan writing, portrait competitions, road safety awareness programs, orientation and sanitization drives, departmental activities, and inter-class competitions. These initiatives contributed to the development of creativity, communication skills, teamwork, leadership qualities, and social awareness among students, complementing academic learning.

**Suggestions:** Future plans may include inter-college co-curricular competitions, regular student-led clubs, and integration of co-curricular activities with curriculum outcomes to enhance student engagement and holistic development.

### Extra-Curricular Activities

Extra-curricular activities played a vital role in nurturing students' cultural and physical talents. Cultural events like *Samagam*, Freshers' Social, Farewell Functions, and participation in Youth Festivals provided platforms for artistic expression and preservation of local culture. Sports participation remained strong, with 168 students

participating in various games and medals won at inter-college level, reflecting emphasis on physical fitness and competitive spirit.

**Suggestion:** The institution may strengthen extra-curricular engagement by providing advanced coaching facilities, organizing more cultural exchanges, and encouraging greater participation of students at state and national levels.


### Extension Activities


